

Lev. 14:1

The Lord spoke to Moses, saying: 2 This shall be the ritual for a leper [הַמְצֹרֵעַ] at the time that he is to be cleansed.

When it has been reported to the priest,

3 the priest shall go outside the camp. If the priest sees that the leper [הַמְצֹרֵעַ] has been healed of his scaly [תַּלְחָת] affection, 4 the priest shall order two live clean birds, cedar wood, crimson stuff, and hyssop to be brought for him who is to be cleansed.

tzarua [5 occurrences]

Lev. 13:44 ... the man is leprous; he is unclean.

Lev. 13:45 As for the person with a leprous affection ...

Lev. 14:3 If the priest sees that the leper has been healed of his scaly affection ...

Lev. 22:4 No man of Aaron's offspring who has an eruption ...

Num. 5:2 Instruct the Israelites to remove from camp anyone with an eruption ...

metzora [15 occurrences]

Exod 4:6 – Moses' hand is “encrusted with snowy scales”

Lev 14:2

Num 12:10 (twice) – Miriam is “stricken with [snow-white] scales”

2 Sam 3:29 – Joab's house is cursed never to be without someone “suffering from an eruption” or the like

2 Kgs 5:1, 11, 27 – Naaman “was a leper,” has an “affected part,” “was snow-white with leprosy”

HALOT

צָרַע: probably denominative vb. from → צָרַעַת; cf. ? Akk. *sennettu(m)* (AHw. 1090b) a skin disease; Eth. *ṣərnə'ət* (Dillman *Lex.* 1275) rash, mange

1Kings 11:26 Jeroboam son of Nebat, an Ephraimite of Zeredah, the son of a widow whose name was **Zeruah**, was in Solomon's service; he raised his hand against the king.

1Chr. 2:13 Jesse begot Eliab his first-born, ... 15 Ozem the sixth, David the seventh; 16 their sisters were **Zeruiah** and Abigail.
